## Beginnings of St. Vincent de Paul in Lane County



- Founded in 1954
- Started with a rummage store in a church basement that funded a small social service office
- Today we are Lane County's largest nonprofit human services organization, serving 84,000 people annually









#### **Homeless Services**

- Eugene Service Station provides day shelter, food, showers, clothing, laundry.
- First Place Family Center helps homeless families with children & Oregon's first therapeutic preschool
- Overnight Parking Program: provides legal camping for homeless people living in their vehicles.
- Egan Warming Center









#### **Emergency Services**

- Food boxes for the hungry
- Vouchers for clothing and essential goods
- Rent, utility, prescription assistance









#### Self-Sufficiency Services

- Helps people with barriers to employment find work
- Second Chance Renter's Rehabilitation: helps people with poor rental history establish housing
- Veterans in Progress: helps homeless veterans through employment and training







#### Affordable Housing

- Provides housing for seniors, families, veterans, and individuals in over 1,400 units across Oregon
- Connects residents to educational programs and access to social services
- Leverages local resources to bring in state and federal funds, hires local design and construction firms

- » Revenue from business operations: \$21 million
- » Fiscal year budget 2017-2018
- » Annual revenue: \$42 million

#### **Mattress Kings**


